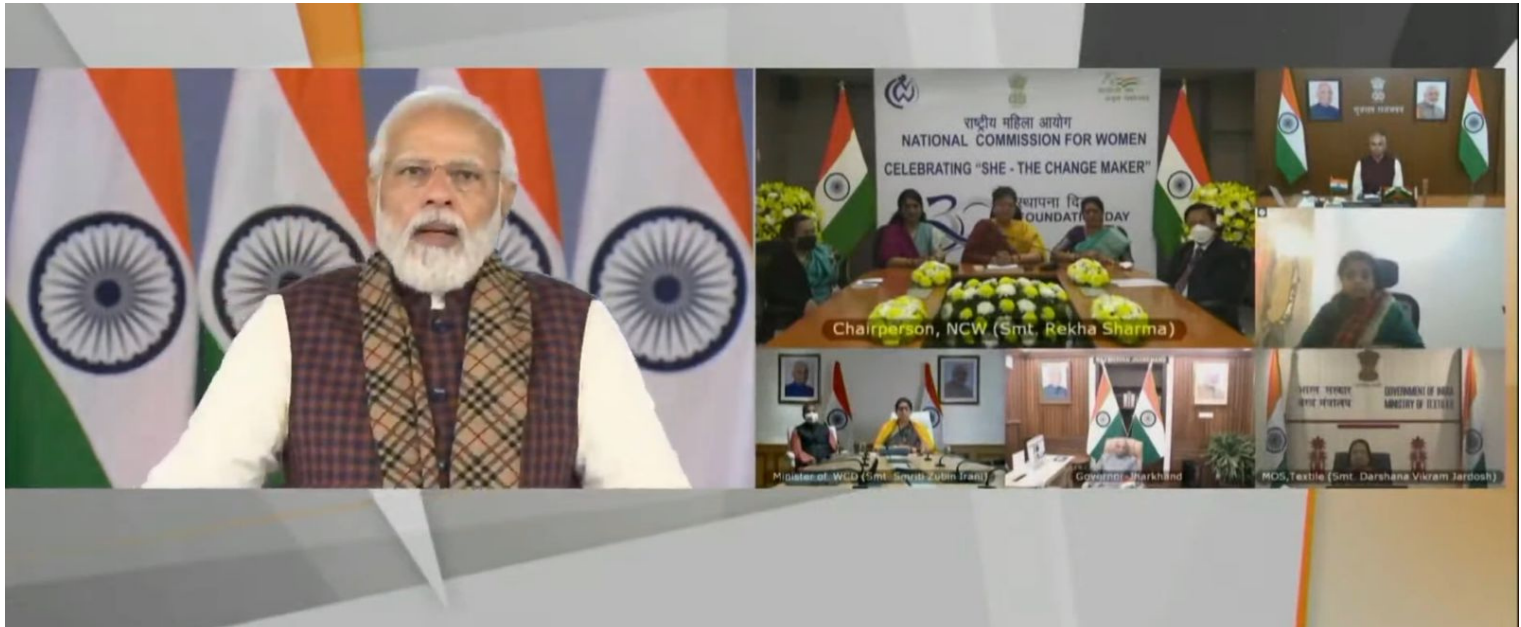




SHE THE CHANGEMAKER - 30TH NCW FOUNDATION DAY

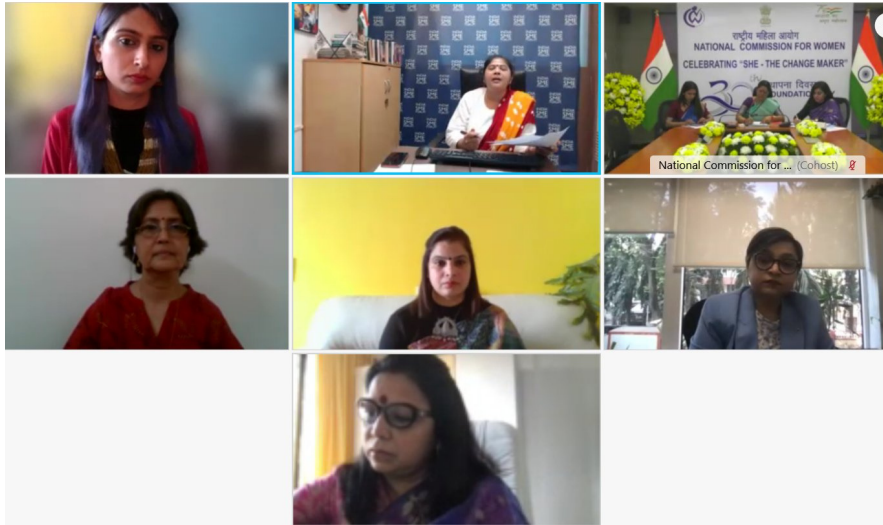


The National Commission for Women celebrated its 30th Foundation Day on January 31st, 2022 under the theme 'She The Change Maker' aimed at celebrating the achievements of women in different fields. Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi addressed the Foundation Day programme via video conference. Union Minister for Women and Child Development Smt Smriti Zubin Irani, Ministers of State Dr. Munjpara Mahendrabhai Kalubhai and Smt Darshana Jardosh and Chairperson, National Commission for Women Ms. Rekha Sharma graced the occasion.

Addressing the gathering, the Prime Minister said, the milestone of 30 years, whether in the life of an individual or of an organization, is very important. As India evolves, the role of women is continuously expanding. Therefore, he said the expansion of the role of the National Commission for Women is also the need of the hour. This is the time for new responsibilities and for moving forward with new energy, he said. Speaking on the occasion, Union Minister for Women and Child Development Smt Smriti Zubin Irani said that under the leadership of the Hon'ble Prime Minister, women have been assured justice and dignity. Chairperson, NCW Ms Rekha Sharma shared information on the programs being conducted by the Commission on women entrepreneurship, digital literacy, legal awareness, capacity building, online training and personality development of women. She also presented a short film before the Prime Minister on the steps taken by the Commission for empowering women.

As part of the Foundation Day celebrations, NCW held a series of panel discussions on 'Women Entrepreneurs Driving the Change', 'Women in Decision Making' and 'Digital Empowerment of Women'. The event was divided into three parts; morning, afternoon and evening session for which the Commission invited eminent Experts, Ministers, Politicians, Policy Makers, and Industry Leaders to take part.

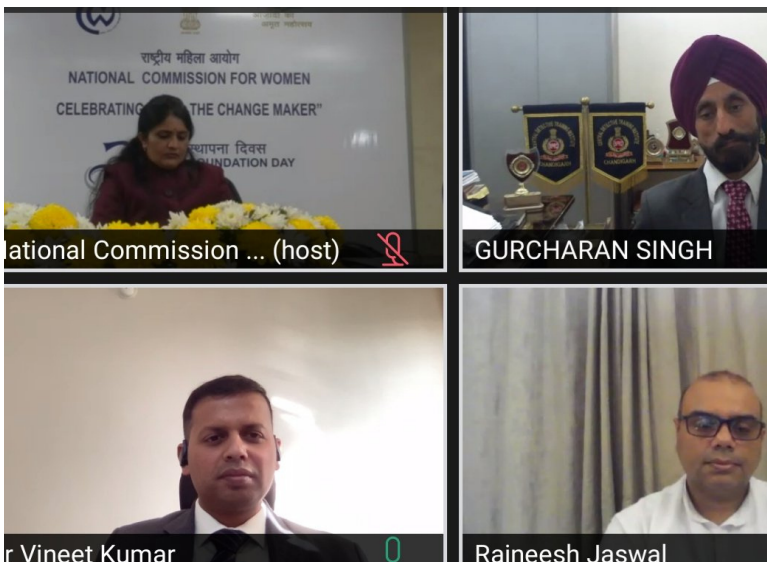
Women in Decision Making

In the afternoon session, the Commission held two panel discussions; 'Women in Decision Making' and 'Digital Empowerment of Women'. 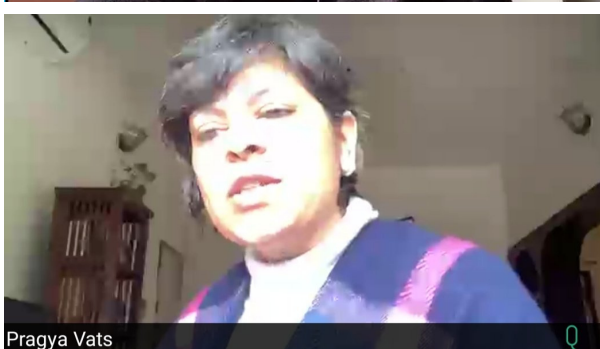
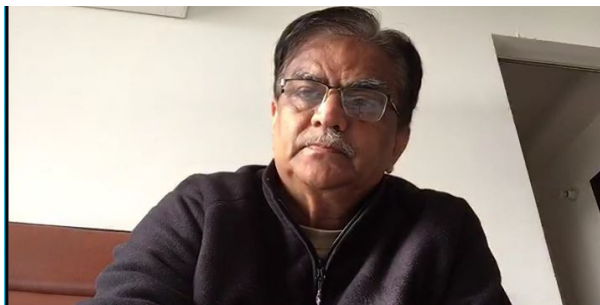
Webinar on 'Save The Girl Child'

The National Commission for Women (NCW) organized a webinar on 'Save The Girl Child' on the National Girl Child Day to promote rights of girl child and to increase awareness on various topics concerning girls including their education, health and nutrition. The discussion aimed at promoting a new perspective towards girl child by changing the society's attitude towards girls and creating awareness on decreasing the discrimination faced by them. Hon'ble Chairperson Ms Rekha Sharma, Shri O.P. Dhankar, Former Cabinet Minister, Haryana Govt and Pragya Vats, Head of Campaign, Save The Children attended the webinar as panelists. The Chairperson touched upon various issues concerning girls' education, health, freedom of choice and right to make decisions. She said that girls stand on equal footing to boys in all spheres of life and that the government has been initiating women-centric policies to promote girl's education.

"Girls have proven their mettle in every field and the National Commission for Women, through its programs has been ensuring safety and empowerment of girls in every sphere. Consultation on Review of Criminal Law-Improvement in Status of Women

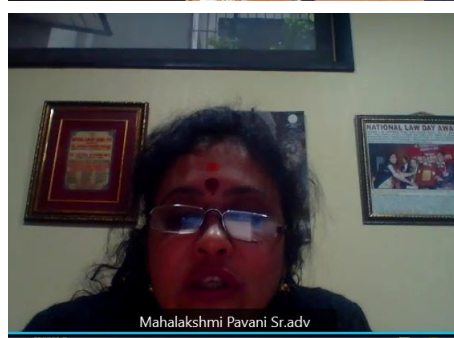

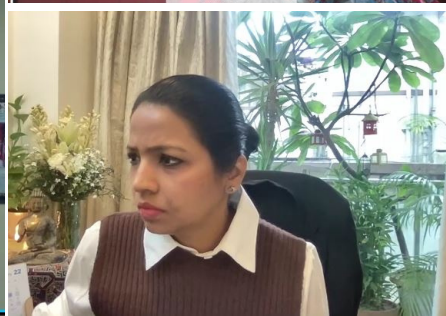

NATIONAL GIRL CHILD DAY: EMPOWERING THE ARCHITECTS OF NEW INDIA

As we celebrate 75 years of Independence, the need for empowerment of girls is an idea that everyone acknowledges as crucial to the growth of India. The present government led by Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi has been a vocal champion of empowering girls. We are witnessing a new India which gives priority to enabling girls with opportunities to realize their potential and demonstrate their leadership qualities. In an endeavour to make girls independent and employment-ready, the Commission launched a country-wide capacity building and personality development course for women Undergraduate and Post graduate students. Under the program, NCW is collaborating with Central and State Universities for organizing sessions on personal capacity building, professional career skills and digital literacy and effective use of social media to prep girl students for entering the job market. We need more leaders in every field and the course launched by NCW will prepare girls in being efficient leaders.

The Commission has also been collaborating with Meta and Cyber Peace Foundation for digital literacy of girls through its program, 'We Think Digital'. The project was launched as Digital Shakti in 2018, under which 60,000 women and girls were trained in digital literacy and online safety across India. The program has seen participation from across the country and has sensitized over 1,60,000 women and girls in its previous two phases. The third and current phase of the project aims to sensitize 1.50 lakh women and girls.

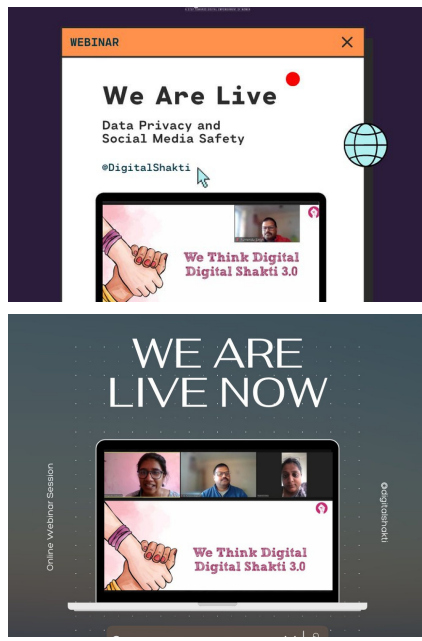
New India has been paving ways for enabling girls with opportunities to demonstrate their leadership qualities. It is a matter of pride that girls are coming forward to play more significant roles in the development of the nation. The government is leading with its women-centric policies and by ensuring better women representation in every field.
