In a significant move to bolster the fight against cyber crimes targeting women, the National Commission for Women (NCW), in partnership with the CyberPeace Foundation, has proudly inaugurated the "Digital Shakti Center." The new center, aptly named DigitalShakti, was formally launched by the Hon'ble Chairperson, Ms. Rekha Sharma, at the NCW premises. The establishment of the Digital Shakti Center marks a pivotal step in addressing the rising concerns over cyber threats faced by women.







The Hon'ble Chairperson of the National Commission for Women led a fact-finding Team to visit Asha Kiran, a Delhi government-run Shelter Home for individuals with intellectual disabilities located in Rohini. This visit followed a distressing report of over 14 deaths, including eight women, at the facility in just the past month. During the visit, the Team found several serious issues, including poor medical care, unsanitary conditions, overcrowding, lack of safe drinking water, contaminated food, and insufficient staff training. These findings pointed to significant administrative failures.

The program underscored the importance of creating opportunities for women to excel in technology-driven fields and contribute to their communities.
