In a collaborative effort, the National Commission for Women and the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) organized the "Awareness on Anti-Human Trafficking" seminar at the DMRC Auditorium, Metro Bhawan, New Delhi. Hon'ble Chairperson of NCW, Ms. Rekha Sharma, highlighted the multifaceted nature of trafficking, extending beyond slavery and sexual exploitation to include underage domestic workers, women in surrogacy, organ transplants, and even militants trafficking young women and children for illegal activities. With a commitment to combat Anti-Human Trafficking unwavering, this marks the fourth seminar jointly hosted by NCW and CISF, signaling a continued strong partnership in addressing this societal challenge.





At the Gateway of India in Mumbai, Hon'ble Chairperson of NCW addressed a pressing concern - "Stop the Street Harassment." Advocating for women's rightful presence in public spaces and breaking free from historical constraints, she emphasized that a true hero does not engage in stalking or participate in any form of Eve teasing. This powerful statement was delivered during the L'Oreal Stop the Street Harassment event at the Gateway of India. Furthermore, she urged leading male actors to reject roles that depict men harassing women on the street for attention, calling for a redefinition of heroism in cinema and the promotion of narratives that embody respect and dignity.

The National Commission for Women persists in its commitment to fostering safer workplaces. Commission organized a PoSH Awareness workshop for the Amritsar Police Department, providing training to 215 dedicated personnel on preventing workplace sexual harassment.





The National Commission for Women, in partnership with Delhi Judicial Academy, conducted a "Gender Sensitisation Workshop for Judicial Officers" at NLU, Delhi. Legal professionals and Judicial Officers in training actively participated, emphasizing the need for a gender-sensitive judiciary and identifying instances of gender bias in the dispensation of justice.





The Women Entrepreneurship Workshop, a collaborative effort between NCW and NIAS in Bangalore, conducted a 2-day event focused on Natural Resource Entrepreneurship. The agenda included discussions on Conservation, Branding, Financing, Tech, and other relevant topics, with the overarching goal of empowering women to take leadership roles in this crucial sector.
