Rationalization regarding treatment of various proposals received in the National Commission for Women. (Received from R&S Cell)

The following decisions were taken in the matter:-

- a) The Commission would receive proposals on the basis of the personal knowledge of the Chairperson or Members about the quality of NGOs and their ability for holding such LAPs or Research Studies/Conferences or Seminars. Such proposals as may be recommended by the CP or Members through their personal knowledge of the organization would be treated at the rate of 4-5 proposals per month per Member. The proposals received outside the knowledge of C.P./Members would be referred to the concerned Member in charge of a particular State for verifying the credibility of the NGO in accordance with the various criteria already evolved.
- & Child Development Department and also through the Social Welfare Department of the concerned State Governments, to enable effective scrutiny at the State level. The State Governments would be addressed in this regard, indicating the priority areas of the Commission on which the Commission
